Accomplishments in 2022

A township's most important responsibility is maintaining and improving township roads. It is important that we are transparent in tracking the outcomes of any goals or initiatives we undertake. Princeton Township establishes goals each year covering road maintenance and improvement.

The Township's goals for 2022 were to:

- 1. Implement the comprehensive road plan, for all roads in the Township, which was developed and approved by the Board of Supervisors over the past two years.**
- 2. Determine priorities based on data and facts.**
- 3. Address needs and assure due diligence and fiscal responsibility for township residents.**

The **2022 Princeton Township Comprehensive Road Maintenance Plan** detailed six primary focus areas, with each focus area providing improved outcomes and budget management. The six primary focus areas to meet these goals, and their improved outcomes included:

- 1. Gravel Road Maintenance:** Developed ongoing 3-year rotating graveling plan. Improved grading and dust control for high traffic roads to meet established criteria.
- 2. Paved Road Maintenance:** More than 95% of paved roads had been under-maintained prior to 2020. Starting in 2020 and by the summer of 2023, over 95% of paved roads will have received the necessary routine maintenance.
- 3. Snow Removal:** Snow removal has moved to a more cost-effective, contracted service, reducing costs to residents, and increasing responsiveness.
- 4. Mowing & Brush Removal:** Mowing and brush removal has similarly moved to a more cost-effective, contracted service. Some brushing and tree trimming continues to be completed by township employees.
- 5. Safety & Signage:** The Township has developed and implemented accurate inventory, policy, and process regarding maintenance of safety and signage.
- 6. Comprehensive Budget Plan:** The Township has established a Comprehensive Budget Plan to address all previously mentioned maintenance needs and services, as required by State Statutes.

2022 Accomplishments (Continued)



Completed road maintenance in 2022:

- 9.2 miles of crack filling
 - In 2022 the critically needed crack filling was addressed for the vast majority of the township's paved roads.
- 2.9 miles of chip sealing.
- ~1 mile of road repair, overlay, or reclaim and pave.
 - 50th Avenue south of State Highway 95

2023 Focus

In 2023, the southeast third of the Township will be our focus area for graveling, brushing and tree trimming. Miscellaneous locations throughout the Township will also be addressed as needed.

Permits:

Permits are required for:

- New home construction
- Building a deck or porch (if attached to a house)
- Installing a fireplace, chimney, or wood stove
- Plumbing alterations
- Finishing a basement
- Additions to a house or garage
- Sheds over 200 square feet in floor area (10 feet x 20 feet)
- Underground Sprinkler Systems
- Fences over 7 feet in height
- Retaining walls higher than 4 feet
- Window and Door Replacement
- Swimming pools of 5,000 gallons or more
- Reroofing or Residing of Buildings
- Driveways and Culverts
- Air conditioners (not including window air conditioners)
- Building demolition
- Burning Permits are available through the **DNR**

- Septic Systems are obtained through **Mille Lacs County**

Snow Season Reminders:

***It is against the law to plow snow from a driveway into or across a public road.**

*During snowplow season **no parking** is allowed alongside a township road or on the shoulder. Keeping roadways clear ensures that the snowplow operator can clear the roads fully from side to side.

***Gravel roads will not be plowed until the ground is frozen, nor plowed after the spring thaw.**

MATERIALS MUST BE EMPTY AND RINSED WITH CAPS ON; DO NOT FLATTEN.

- Milk Cartons & Juice Boxes
- Broth & Other Liquid Carton Containers

METAL & GLASS

MATERIALS MUST BE EMPTY AND RINSED WITH CAPS ON; PLACE METAL LIDS IN CAN AND PINCH SHUT.

- Aluminum Cans
- Steel/Tin Cans
- Brown, Clear & Green Glass Food & Beverage Containers
