Open Forum:

Mike Glenn: He would like to find out how to get a variance for his current property. New Freedom, Inc.'s treatment center is on the north side of the City of Princeton. He is looking to build onto the south side of the property. He wants to build a new structure which would be in compliance with the State of Minnesota in-patient requirements. The new structure would be in the same right of way as the current. He currently owns houses on both sides of the road.

• Supervisor Hiller stated he does not know the exact information the State is asking for but that Mr. Glenn would need to talk to Scott Richards about getting the variance. He needs to go through the steps and put the information from the State into the packet for Scott to consider.

Gary Johnson: He bought his land in 2004, which is located in Princeton Township. It was purchased with plans to build once he retired, while now he has concerns that he will not be able to go forward. As he understands there can only be so many houses on every 40 acres. This spring someone has built a house near him, which would be the max amount for the area. The owner before him had 2 different land parcels, one was 19 acres and the other 8. He paid more for the 8 acres so that he would be able to build in the future. He is under the impression that the 19 acres was unbuildable because of the closing documents that he got during the purchase of his land.
